Ektimo shares its production space with Ross Road Custom Crush, host to 15-20 clients making excellent, small volume wines.

Blue (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and blueberry wine), Ghlas

Roden Wines, Cotati, CA (consulting winemaker) – Wayne Roden makes a tiny amount of elegant Pinot Noir from his own vineyard, along with single vineyard Napa Valley Merlot and Dry Creek Cabernet Sauvignon.
